

#### **Moving Forward Together**

If ever there was a year for our Futuro Verde community to come together, the challenges 2017 presented us gave us reason to unite, to lift one another up and to feel the support from those around us. The challenges were many: a set goal of \$140,000 to raise toward our scholarship fund, the final step in our IB accreditation process and the looming need to complete minimum infrastructure and materials requirements needed for quality instruction to be assured. And those were just the challenges we knew of beforehand. Little did we know that mid-vear would bring us a series of health crises that meant turnover in several beloved staff members. As we know all too well life in the jungle is never simple and 2017 was no exception! I am so proud to say we met all of the challenges we faced successfully. By the end of last year, we had achieved so much:

- → In April our students fronted a coordinated effort, joined by board members, parents, community members and the like, to tackle the Earth Day Charity Challenge, raising thousands of dollars for important initiatives in our local area.
- → At the end of May we received our IB verification visit! Two days of intense interviews ended with a vote of confidence and encouragement from

- the evaluators and a long list of pending needs to be done in the next couple of months.
- → June brought us our 3rd annual International Conference on Bilingual, Holistic and Sustainable Education and our staff left reinspired and rejuvenated in their teaching.
- → July and August were big months for the acquiring of materials and the completion of infrastructure projects. The final touches were put on our library spaces and our science and music laboratories finished taking shape. Thanks to a generous Futuro Verde supporter, \$15,000 worth of books, curriculum and materials for students pre-k through the IB years was ordered and began arriving in shipping containers.
- → September brought our students out in force to celebrate Costa Rican Independence with beautiful presentations at the county bullring, and with all our students bringing their talent to the Independence Day parade and their strength and speed to the Torch Run.
- → By October, good news was in the works with confirmation that, in 2018, Futuro Verde would become an IB World School.
- → We didn't think it could get much better, and yet it did. Our final group of graduating 11th graders all passed their Costa Rican bachillerato exams! We were so proud!
- → In December, our students inspired with their sustainable solutions projects by hosting a community fair meant to teach and inspire the greater community to commit to sustainable practices for the good of our planet.

I encourage you to take the time to read through this report and to see the amazing successes Futuro Verde has had this past year! As I often feel, yet don't say quite enough, it is an enormous pleasure to lead this amazing school and to work each day with our incredible students, parents, staff and community of supporters. Thank you for all you do and for accompanying us on this unforgettable educational journey!

### Investment in infrastructure and resources

#### **Facilities and installations**

Following the decision to remain at the existing location, and the negotiation of a 40-year lease agreement, a long-term and short-term program for investment in facilities and installations was developed. Although the first stage of this plan was largely focused on satisfying requirements for International Baccalaureate accreditation, students of all ages benefited directly, in multiple ways. The work was financed by a combination of capital investment by the school and generous donors.

- → Purpose-built preschool facility with the creation of two new rooms geared towards our youngest learners.
- → Multimedia room equipped with twenty desktop computers and internet access.
- → Primary and high school libraries with built-in shelving, comfortable reading areas, and study spaces.
- → Music room with open and versatile space as well as air conditioning to ensure instruments are protected in a climate-controlled environment.
- → Science laboratory equipped with tiled benches, sinks, gas, electrical points, and all necessary safety measures to allow students to do practical work in small groups.
- → Resource room provides provides a central point for our teachers to print, photocopy, laminate, and access all the materials they require to deliver quality lessons.

#### Resources

- → Musical instruments and recording equipment.
- → Science lab materials and safety equipment.
- → Physical and digital resources for our library inventory. These included new titles for all students of all ages in both Spanish and English across all subject areas.
- → EBSCO school site license which allows students to access filtered academic research databases.
- → Literacy programs in English and Spanish.





#### **Arts and Music**

The Arts Department was active and innovative in the 2017 school year. Highlights include:

- ★ The first annual Futuro Verde's Got Talent Show, held in May which showcased talented Futuro Verde students in the performing arts, literary arts and visual arts. Many of the winners went on to participate in the Costa Rican Ministry of Education's Festival de Artes Estudiantiles with two winners reaching the final National Showcase in November in San Jose.
- ★ In June Futuro Verde hosted the first annual Futuro Verde Trashion Show, which was held during the BHS Conference on campus. Student created designs of rescued and repurposed trash ranged from superhero ninja outfits, to trendy casual wear, to glamorous ball gowns. These ready-to-wear creations were modeled by students and a couple of brave staff members.
- ★ Inspired by the devastation of some Costa Rican communities by the Tropical Storm Nate, Futuro Verde high school students hosted an **Empty Bowls** sale of functional ceramic bowls created by the students in their Art Studio. The sale was held in conjunction with the annual Thanksgiving luncheon and raised over 100,000 colones! These funds were given as a direct donation to a needy family from one of the areas most deeply affected by Tropical Storm Nate, Perez Zeledón, which just happens to be the hometown community of our Social Studies teacher, Karol.
- ★ At the close of the 2017 school year, the annual RAP (Respeto, Amor y Paz) celebration provided yet another opportunity to showcase our students' artistic talents. Musical performances from all levels took center stage. Complimenting the show, a curated exhibit of selected student artworks was displayed in the new Music Room. Furthermore, an interactive art installation "What Lifts You?", inspired by the artist Kelsey Montague provided a colorful portrait and selfie opportunity for the community.

### Authorized: Futuro Verde - an IB World School.

A highlight of 2017 was undoubtedly receiving the official final authorization decision from the IB director general on the 2nd of October. Futuro Verde is now an International Baccalaureate (IB) World School, authorized to offer the diploma program.

**Commendations:** The verification visit report echoed some of the positive comments we heard from the site inspectors in May. Our students did a wonderful job and made us so proud. They talked with passion and knowledge and really conveyed the essence of Futuro Verde, reinforcing why the school is so aligned with the IB philosophy.

**Development and growth:** Since the formal authorization was received, school administration, the board, teachers and students have continued to prepare for the launch of the program on February 1st, 2018. Recommendations in the report focused our attention on specific areas, which will only help us develop and grow, enabling us to offer a strong diploma program to all our students. Thanks to generous donations and effective budgeting, all resources have been purchased and facilities have built or improved, which benefits everyone in the school community. Futuro Verde now proudly boasts an equipped science laboratory, a multi-media lab, separate primary and high school libraries, a new music room, a renovated art room, and a new classroom for business management, language acquisition and Theory of Knowledge.










